## Summer Reading List

### 2011 - 2012

One of the best things you can do this summer to prepare your child for school is to read many picture books to your child. According to Jim Trelease "reading aloud stimulates a child's imagination, stretches their attention span, improves their listening comprehension, nurtures their emotional development, establishes a reading/writing connection, and reshapes their negative attitudes into positive ones". Most importantly, you will be making memories with your child that they will never forget *and neither will you*. The love for reading is contagious. Help your child develop a love of reading.

Students will be responsible for reading **two** books and completing one project for kindergarten prior to the first day of school. Students may bring their projects on the first day of school.

Some suggested projects:

1. Create a new book cover. Include an attractive cover design, summary of the book and information about the author.
2. Make a poster to advertise your book.
3. Design a t-shirt for your character.
4. Draw three pictures that show events from the beginning, middle, and end of the story. Write a sentence that describes each picture.
5. Make a shoebox exhibit to show an interesting part of the book.
6. Make three bookmarks about the book. Show a main character, an important scene, and the main idea of the book.
7. Make a PowerPoint presentation about your book. Save it onto a disk.
8. Display your favorite part of the book in any other innovative way.
